## Trip to Livarot—Thursday 21st—Monday 25th May 2015

As you all know, we will be celebrating our 40th anniversary of Twinning with Livarot, so we are anticipating an exciting weekend. (Let's hope the weather is kind to us).

We will be leaving from South Molton Car Park very early (around 7.00 a.m.) on the Thursday as we have a daytime crossing, from Portsmouth to Le Havre, rather than overnight. We will then arrive in Livarot around 7.30 p.m. This means that we have the day on Friday for a coach trip, the cost of which is already included, but we will need to decide where we would like to visit.

We will then leave on the Monday with a daytime ferry crossing once again and arriving home around midnight.

We will be travelling with Blakes Coaches next year and the total cost of the trip will be approximately £100 per person (quite a saving on our last trip).

We do need a deposit of £40 per person to be paid as soon as possible please, but by 31st October 2014 at the latest, in order for us to be able to secure the ferry crossings. The balance will then be due by 12th March 2015. Please contact Lorraine (574255) or put a note with your payment through her door.

Margaret is able to arrange travel insurance through the Twinning Circle as in the past, and the cost for this is in the region of  $\pounds$ 11.43 per person, to cover 6 days. If you need this insurance please get in touch with Margaret and she will confirm the exact amount payable.
