Tree Planting: As mentioned in the last newsletter, the tree planting to commemorate our 40th anniversary is now going ahead and on our behalf the Livarot Committee will acquire an acer palmatum "Bloodgood" which bears red leaves and we will purchase the same on their behalf for planting here. Good news is that our respective councils have very kindly agreed to pay for the trees and here in South Molton we have been offered a site in the centre of the new part of the extended cemetery.

The Livarot Twinning Committee have asked that the respective trees are planted in March (this is a much better time of year for tree planting, rather than waiting until our planned trip in May) and they have suggested that we send representatives to Livarot in early March in order to do this. A few of us have offered to attend and March 6th has been suggested, but there are no definite plans as yet. We were hoping that a deputation from Livarot would be able to come to South Molton for the planting here, but at the moment it is not looking as though this will be possible for them and we have not chosen a definite date.

We will take a suitably worded plaque when we make our official trip in May, which can be placed by the tree in Livarot. Let us

hope that the trees thrive as well as our Twinning has done!

Trip to Livarot— Thursday 21st—Monday 25th May:

We now have 49 people booked for our trip to Livarot which is helping to keep the cost down for us. Excitement mounts as we can confirm that founder members of our twinning, Wyn and Di Smith (who now live in France) will be joining us in Livarot for the weekend and also we will have with us former members Norman and Margaret Chambers.

We have yet to decide on the destination of our coach outing on the Friday and no doubt this can be discussed at our February meeting. We do have several informative leaflets concerning the town of Bernay which has beautiful architecture, churches, museums, shops and cafes. There is an organised walking tour of the town and also a chateau nearby (Chateau de Beaumesnil).

February Meeting: Our next meeting will be on Thursday 12th February, 7.30 p.m. at The George Hotel. As in the past, this will be our planning meeting, as we try to organise our calendar of events for the year. We would very much appreciate some new ideas for fund-raising events as well as suggestions for outings, so please do try to come along if you possibly can.
